Double Check Your Credit

Standing!

Credits – Below are the credit requirements for your senior. If all of the requirements are not met, diplomas will not be issued and students will not participate in the graduation ceremony. Each student must meet **all** requirements.

In order to graduate from Delavan-Darien High School in 2012, a student must have accumulated a minimum of 24 credits. These credits must include the following:

- ❑ A minimum of 4 credits in English distributed as follows: English 9, English 10, and a minimum of 2 credits of English during the junior and senior years (1/2 credit of these 2 credits must be in a composition course).
- ❑ A minimum of 3 credits in Social Studies as follows: World Geography, 1 credit; U.S. History, 1 credit; European History to 1500, Modern European History 1500 to Present, World Events, 1/2 credit or AP European History, 1 credit; American Political Systems, 1/2 credit or AP Government & Politics, 1 credit.
- ❑ A minimum of 1 credit in Biological Science and 1 credit in Physical Science. Biological Science credits can be earned as follows: Biology, 1 credit; Animal Science, 1/2 credit; Botany, 1/2 credit. Physical Science credits can be earned as follows: General Science, 1 credit; Physical, Earth and Agricultural Science, 1/2 credit; Biotechnology, 1/2 credit; Environmental Science, 1/2 credit; Earth Science, 1 credit; Chemistry, 1 credit; Principles of Engineering, 1 credit; or Physics, 1 credit.
- ❑ A minimum of 2 credits in mathematics.
- ❑ A minimum of 1½ credits in Physical Education.
- ❑ ½ credit in Health.
- ❑ A minimum of 1/4 credit in Fine Arts.
- ❑ A minimum of 1/4 credit in Vocational Education. (CTE)



Local Scholarships

Local scholarship meetings are Tuesday, April 3rd and Wednesday, April 4th at 7:00 am or 2:35 pm. Students must attend one of these meetings to get the scholarship information. The scholarship applications are due back to Student Services by 2:30 pm on Thursday, April 12th. Almost all of the local scholarships require community service. If you need your community service hours included with your local scholarship application, the completed community service forms must be turned in to Mrs. Pelnar by Tuesday, April 10th, 2012.
